URI SUMMER STUDY ABROAD IN AKKO, ISRAEL

JULY 4 - JULY 30, 2010

Location:

Location: The Akko, Archaeology, Heritage and History Project will explore the ancient and modern heritage of this UNESCO World Heritage city. The focus of the excavations and field school will be the ancient tel of Akko, occupied from the late 4th millennium BC through the Hellenistic period. In addition, the excavation will work with Akko's major stakeholders: Old Acre Development Company (under the ministry of Tourism), Amidar (Israel National Housing Company, owner of abandoned properties), UNESCO, Israel Antiquities Authority, the local municipality, local and diverse communities, private investors and local businesses.

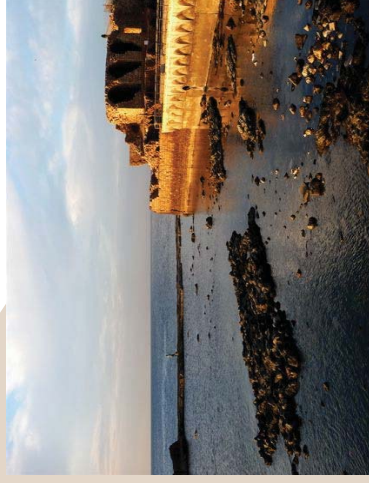
Included in the program costs (as a part of the curriculum) are a number of tours. Students will spend approximately 2.5 days with local experts focusing on Akko's past and present, learning about this World Heritage City. In addition, they will spend 2 days traveling around Israel, guided by various members of the Dig's professional staff.

Academics:

The program will offer two (2) four (4) credits courses. The courses will be on:

Course 1: *Archaeological Theory and Field Methods*. Hands on introduction to the field methods and theory of archaeological work.

Course 2: *Akko: Public Archaeology, Conservation and Heritage*. Akko, case study in Public Archaeology, Conservation and Heritage.



It is the student's responsibility to request transcripts from the program provider upon completion of the summer study abroad program.

Financial Aid may be available to qualifying students. If you plan to use Financial Aid to pay part of your summer study abroad program costs, you must meet with a financial aid advisor in Green Hall to determine your eligibility. Scholarships are available to URI Students ONLY.
